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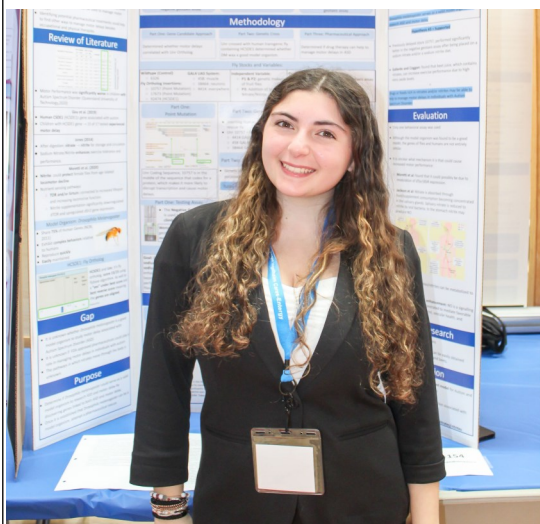
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# Future of Medicine Award Winner: Nicole Giandomenico—Harrison High School Cellular & Molecular Biology



## Abstract

According to the US Centers for Disease Control (2020), for every fifty-four children diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), a developmental disorder, one in six of those children will also experience motor delays. The purpose of this experiment was to determine if *Drosophila melanogaster* could serve as a valid model organism to research ASD and motor delay by defining novel genes linked to both ASD and motor delay. Then use the connection between humans and the model organism to conduct research on ASD and motor delay. The gene CSDE1 was identified as a possible candidate for motor delays in autism patients and used in the study because the human gene and the fly ortholog Unr had the best forward and reverse scores in Flybase. The methodology entailed three parts: 1. A gene candidate approach to identify if

the fly stocks had motor delays. 2. A genetic cross to rescue the motor delay identified in part 1 through overexpression of human CSDE1. 3. A pharmaceutical rescue to determine if motor delays can be enhanced with drugs. The negative geotaxis assay was used to assess whether motor delay was present in *Drosophila*. The results showed that the hypothesis was supported and the fly ortholog with the Unr mutation performed significantly worse ( $p < .05$ ) than the wildtype control meaning that *Drosophila melanogaster* could serve as a valid model for autism and motor delays. The results also showed when the fruit flies were placed on a food diet infused with sodium nitrate and sodium nitrite, the Unr mutation performed significantly better.

## Bio & Future Plans

I have been a part of the science research program at Harrison High School for the last three years. I have focused on the connection between Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and motor delay, precisely ways to manage motor delays. I did this by conducting a genetic cross to determine if *Drosophila melanogaster*, or fruit flies, was a good model organism for ASD. Then, I took a pharmaceutical approach to determine if nitrate/nitrite supplementation could be a potential way to manage motor delays. Throughout my career in science research, I have experienced great success. My genetic cross and my pharmaceutical approach were successful, and I am interested in further exploring whether or not nitrate/nitrate-rich supplements/diets can help individuals with ASD manage their motor delays. In addition, my peers coined the name “fly expert” for me because of the amount of time I spent in the classroom doing my research. My future plans are to attend Ithaca College in the fall. I am going to be majoring in psychology and minoring in neuroscience. I am still determining what path I would like to take, but I do know that I want to work in a lab throughout my college career.



# Future of Medicine Award Winner: Abby Eickelbeck—Byram Hills High School Neuroscience



**Title:** Toward an ideal nerve-specific hydrogel treatment: An investigation of FluoroMyelin green as an essential component of a macrophage specific stain

**Abstract:** Peripheral nerve damage is a severe and life-altering injury, burdening patients with painful axon decay. Injuries often reduce quality of life and lead to destructive symptoms, including numbness, paralysis, and neuromas. Yet, despite all this, current treatments are insufficient in repairing axons and increasing patient recovery levels, leading to the need for new therapeutic advancements. Thus, an overarching study will test the impact of macrophages on the success of a novel nerve-specific hydrogel treatment. Macrophages are crucial to both degeneration and regeneration, yet their effect on the hydrogel remains unknown. To assist this larger project, the current

study focused on advancing a macrophage-specific stain by gaining a comprehensive understanding of FluoroMyelin green (FMg), a necessary dye providing structural images of the myelin sheath. This research is vital as current immunofluorescent staining protocols cannot yet differentiate macrophages from other immune cells in the nerve microenvironment, causing inaccurate data collection for the overarching study. Present research uncovered the preferable green wavelength emission spectrum of FMg compared to FluoroMyelin red, as FMg allows for simultaneous multiple channel staining. A variety of FMg stains were optimized including CD31 for blood vessels and NF200 for axon filaments. Additionally, this study validated FMg's ability to identify crush injury sites in neurons and succeed as a structural indicator both cross-sectionally and longitudinally, overall enhancing the reagent's functionality. Ultimately, our improved staining method will aid the overarching study in enhancing the nerve-specific hydrogel treatment, all in all helping to regain patients' functional recovery and quality of life.

## Short bio:

Abby Eickelbeck is currently a senior at Byram Hills High School and a student in the Authentic Science Research Program. Over the course of three years, Abby studied peripheral nerve regeneration, specifically looking at the impact of macrophages on the success of a novel nerve-specific hydrogel treatment. With the help of her mentor, Dr. Bryan Brown, she conducted a study analyzing the role of Fluoromyelin green in an immunofluorescent nerve stain. Next year she will be attending The George Washington University and studying international affairs with a minor in dance. 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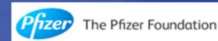
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
